



Frequently Asked Questions

Who qualifies for the Single Marine Program?

All Single or Unaccompanied Active Duty personnel. There is no "Membership" for the program, all eligible service members are automatically included.

If I have a girlfriend or boyfriend can I still participate in the SMP activities and events ?

Absolutely, you will be completely eligible for the program's benefits until you are married.

Is the SMP a dating service ?

No, we are a Quality of Life program dedicated to serving the single Service members .

If I have an idea for an event can I present it to the program for consideration ?

Yes, and please do, new ideas are what keep this program running. You have two options to present ideas. You may present the idea directly to the SMP council or work with your unit representative and they will speak for you.

How do I contact my unit representative?

If your unit rep has not yet had direct contact with you, then you should utilize your chain of command or your base SMP coordinator to seek him or her out.

If my unit does not have a representative how do I establish one?

Speak with your chain of command and present the issue as a "Quality of Life" concern. Every command should appoint an SMP representative in writing. You can also contact the base SMP coordinator to assist you in working with your command.


How do I become a Unit Representative for the SMP?

If your unit currently does not have an appointed SMP representative, then the answer is the same as above. If your unit does currently have a rep, then you may still come on as an alternate or assistant unit representative. All single Marines regardless of their unit rep status are eligible to serve on the SMP executive council as well.




Benefits of the Program...
