- **Application Deadlines** - Please review application deadlines for updates – <https://admit.washington.edu/apply/>
- **Application Advice** - When filling out the Application for Admission, please complete sections which do not seem directly relevant to your personal, academic, and military experiences to the best of your ability. For example, the application asks about your extracurricular activities, awards, and honors. Veteran applicants should feel free to include military experiences and distinctions, high school experiences, and any other post-secondary experiences in these sections.
 - **Spring quarters** – Engineering and Computer Science applicants in areas of Bioengineering, Bioresource Science & Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Computer Science, and Computer Engineering may submit the transfer online application for spring quarter IF applying to the direct entry program. All documentation due by December 15 deadline

College Admission Policy – Transfer

- Credits Required to Transfer – Any; 60 is better**
- N SAT / ACT – (see notes)
 - Y GPA – 3.0+ (see notes)
 - Y Personal Statement / Essay (see notes)
 - Y Official College Transcripts
 - Y Unofficial High School Transcripts

- **If enter during summer** – means you wish to attend in the autumn quarter as well; failure to enter during the summer cancels your ability to attend in the autumn
- **Quarters** – Autumn starts in late September; Winter starts in early January; Spring starts in late March and Summer starts in Mid-June

- **GPA minimum does not equate to competitive GPA** – Freshman admits have middle 50% high school GPA 3.73 – 3.96; Transfers from Washington State Community College have 3.0 GPA; Transfers from non-Washington Community College have 3.7 GPA; some majors will factor GPA separately

- **SAT / ACT** - The University of Washington no longer requires SAT or ACT scores. Students who have taken the exams are welcome to send their scores, however, there is absolutely not advantage or disadvantage I doing so. Learn more about [SAT/ACT scores](#)
- **Transferable Credit / Online Credit** – generally means liberal arts / science / math credit (e.g. general education) from a regionally accredited 2-year or 4-year, traditional institution; subject to strict review by university AFTER being admitted; JST/DSST/CLEP credit – no credit for DSST or CLEP – none or possibly up to 30 hours of JST credit – no MOS credit

- **Transfer Students **SHOULD NOTE** – Considered a transfer student if take **ANY** college level courses after high school** -transferring into the flagship campus is very competitive. Most successful applicants come with an Associate level degree or 90 quarter hours / 60emester hours with priority given to Washington State Community College applicants; Limited and more competitive acceptance rate for Marines transferring from a non-Washington State Community College or with fewer than proscriber transfer hours.
- **High School and College Transcripts** – Freshman THEY WILL ASK YOU FOR THEM IF NEEDED SO HOLD OFF SENDING
- **Competitive Majors** – note that some majors require Marine to be enrolled at UW before application; some have separate application deadlines; some require Marine to meet admission standards for both overarching UW and major. Being accepted to university but not major puts applicant in as a premajor in the College of Arts and Sciences. Will be able to complete prerequisites and apply to major, but note that some majors have limited application periods. - **Freshman and Transfer Minimum Admissions Requirements** – Freshman <https://admit.washington.edu/apply/freshman/cadr/> and Transfer <https://admit.washington.edu/apply/transfer/cadr/> can meet this through both high school and college coursework/ 1 credit of high school equivalent to 3 semester credits or 5 quarter credits
