- **Application Advice** - When completing your application please complete all sections to the best of your ability. Veteran applicants should feel free to include military experiences and distinctions, high school experiences, and any other post-secondary experiences in these sections. - **Application Fee** - \$75 or request a waiver for financial need
- **GPA minimum does not equate to competitive GPA** –
 - Generally, competitive transfers have 3.5 GPA or higher (average 3.8 GPA). Transfer Student Profile: <https://admissions.umich.edu/apply/transfer-applicants/transfer-student-profile>
 - The average GPA for an incoming first year student is a 3.9. This GPA is the average for the incoming first year class, but there is not a specific GPA you need to have for admission to U of M. Through the holistic review process we will review all aspects of your application. - **Personal Statement / Essay** – Supplemental essay questions can be found at: <https://admissions.umich.edu/apply/first-year-applicants/essay-questions>. First Year and Transfer Applicants will respond to the below questions:
 - 1. Everyone belongs to many different communities and/or groups defined by (among other things) shared geography, religion, ethnicity, income, cuisine, interest, race, ideology, or intellectual heritage. Choose one of the communities to which you belong, and describe that community and your place within it. (Required for all applicants)
 - 2. Describe the unique qualities that attract you to the specific undergraduate College or School (including preferred admission and dual degree programs) to which you are applying at the University of Michigan. How would that curriculum support your interests? (Required for all applicants)
 - 3. Select one prompt from the Common or Coalition Application to respond to. You may review all prompts at the link above.
 - Additional question for Transfers: Please provide a statement that addresses your reasons for transferring and the objectives you hope to achieve.
- **SAT/ACT** - You may review the SAT/ACT averages for first year applicants here: <https://admissions.umich.edu/apply/first-year-applicants/first-year-student-profile>. Please note for the fall 2022 cycle first year applicants will apply under the test flexible policy. If you are applying as a transfer student you may submit your ACT/SAT if you choose to, but it is not required. ACT/SAT tests taken after High School Graduation will not be considered.

- **Transferable Credit / Online Credit** - At U of M you may have the opportunity to transfer in credit. You may utilize the Transfer Credit Equivalency Database to find your specific courses here: <https://transfercredit.ugadmiss.umich.edu/>. Some schools/colleges may accept credit for online courses. See school/college on these guidelines.
- **Letters Of Recommendation** – As a first year student you are required to submit one letter of recommendation. As a transfer student you are not required to submit a letter of recommendation, but may choose to do so.
- **Personal Interview** – Due to the volume of applications we receive each year, personal interviews are not a part of the admissions process for first year or transfer students. We use a holistic review process to review all parts of your application.

- **For Transfer Students** - guidelines on being competitive for admission. Transfers accepted from either 4-year or 2-year institutions.

- o A successful U-M transfer student to the College of Literature, Science, and the Arts (LSA):

1. A specific number of earned credits is not required but competitive transfer candidates typically have two or more semesters of transferable graded college coursework at the time of application.
2. Students who apply with less than two semesters of graded college work completed at the time of application can still be considered as competitive candidates for transfer admission, however more emphasis will be placed upon the high school academic record as part of our evaluative process.

To successfully transfer into the University of Michigan, you will have to demonstrate that your course of study is balanced on a foundation of general education courses that fulfill basic requirements. When evaluating applications, successful U-M transfer students to LSA will have completed a good distribution of coursework that aligns with the areas of distribution for LSA. - o A successful U-M transfer student to the College of Engineering:

Competitive applicants to Michigan Engineering will have completed all of the required prerequisite courses prior to their intended term of enrollment at U-M, with a minimum GPA of 3.0 or higher.

NOTE: Simply meeting the minimum GPA expectations and completion of prerequisites does not guarantee an offer of admission as each application is reviewed individually and holistically.

Michigan Engineering requires the following courses to be completed, "in-progress", or "planned" at the time of application. Prerequisite courses cannot be filled by placement exams administered at other institutions. All required prerequisites must be completed with a letter grade of a "C" or better by the intended term of enrollment at Michigan.

Michigan Engineering - Admission Prerequisites:

- Calculus I

- Calculus II
 - If AP or IB credit was earned for either Calculus I or Calculus II, then Calculus III is required.
 - 1 Calculus Based Physics +Lab
 - 1 General College Chemistry + Lab
 - 1 Computing Course (Engineering 101 or C++ preferred)
 - 1 English Composition
