- **Application Deadlines** – Please review deadlines on Web site for any changes

- **Application Advice** - When filling out the Application for Admission, please complete sections which do not seem directly relevant to your personal, academic, and military experiences to the best of your ability. For example, the application asks about your extracurricular activities, awards, and honors. Veteran applicants should feel free to include military experiences and distinctions, high school experiences, and any other post-secondary experiences in these sections. At times, some schools welcome you to attach /upload/copy and paste a résumé or CV to explain your non-academic experiences more thoroughly.

 - No separate application for Engineering
- **Application Fee / Waiver for Veterans** –Common Application Fee Waiver / Yes to Pre-approved Question on Dartmouth Supplement
- **Essay / Personal Statement**– Common Application Personal Statement (250-650 words) and Dartmouth Writing Supplement (<https://admissions.dartmouth.edu/glossary-term/writing-supplement>)
- **VetLink Addendum:** Veterans may submit the VetLink Addendum (optional): <https://service2school.org/vetlink/>
- **SAT / ACT – Middle 50% range for class of 2025:** SAT CR 710-770 + M 730-790; ACT Composite 32-35
 - **Transfer Students – Dartmouth waives testing requirement for Veteran Applicants**
- **Transferable Credit / Online Credit** - generally means liberal arts / science / math credit (e.g. general education) from a regionally accredited 2-year or 4-year, traditional institution; subject to strict review by university; online credit is generally not accepted at an Ivy institution, but some exceptions may be made. Credit evaluation occurs in the summer before matriculation to the College.
- **JST/DSST/CLEP credit** – credit from non-traditional coursework is generally not accepted, but the Admissions office can review these transcripts for additional context in the Admissions process, so please submit.
- **LORs / Peer Recommendations**– 2 academic / peer recommendation optional: <https://admissions.dartmouth.edu/glossary-term/peer-recommendation>
- **Transfer Student Requirements – Typically**, successful applicants will have recent history of academic achievement in the past two years focusing on general education coursework, preferably full-time attendance at a high GPA; No more than 2, full-time, academic years of transferable credit; not currently enrolled use the “Additional Information” portion in the application to provide background on experiences; Share any Special Circumstances that may have impacted your performance. - **High School / College Prep Courses – Freshman Candidates** – also review the Secondary School Report to determine if your high school had limitations on what level of courses you could take. These are recommendations for a minimum course of study, but are not requirements:
 - **English** – 4 years
 - **Mathematics** – 4 years through calculus
 - **Social Sciences** – 3 years
 - **Laboratory Sciences** – 3 years with 4 years for students interested in engineering
 - **Foreign Language** – 3 years with 4 years preferred
