**College Notes – Students who have completed fewer than 12 college credits after high school graduation or GED attainment should apply as first-year applicants, while those who completed more than 12 college credits after high school graduation or GED attainment should apply as transfer applicants.**

- **Application Advice** - When filling out the Application for Admission, please complete sections which do not seem directly relevant to your personal, academic, and military experiences to the best of your ability. For example, the application asks about your extracurricular activities, awards, and honors. Veteran applicants should feel free to include military experiences and distinctions, high school experiences, and any other post-secondary experiences in these sections.

  - Application Fee / Waiver for Veterans - all Marines using the Common Application or Coalition for College Application are eligible for fee waivers.

- **Mid-year Report** - Regular Decision applicants and admitted Early Decision students must submit a Mid-year Report and updated transcript by mid-February (or as soon as they are available if after the deadline). The Mid-year Report must be submitted directly by the school and must include an updated senior year transcript. School counselors should submit the documents online through the Coalition for College application or Common Application, fax it to (410) 516-6025, or mail the Mid-year Report and transcript.
- **GPA Requirement** – required is a 3.0 (minimum) this refers to transfer eligibility only. They do not have minimum GPA or test scores for the first year process. However, both are selective and holistic – they take the whole application into consideration.
- **Essay**– Must submit an essay via Common Application
  - The essay is to share something you’d like the admissions committee to know about you (your interests, your background, your identity or your community) and how it has shaped what you want to get out of your college experience at Hopkins. (300-400 words). It’s a chance to add depth to something that is important to you and tell the admissions committee more about your background or goals.
- **SAT / ACT** – Because testing availability and access continues to be limited due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Johns Hopkins is extending our test-optional policy for the Class of 2026 (students applying for entry in the fall of 2022). If a student has a test score—SAT, ACT, AP, IB, English language proficiency exams, or others—and feels it is reflective of their academic ability, they welcome any testing submission they choose to share. Transfer admission is permanently test optional regardless of the pandemic.
- **Transferable Credit / Online Credit** – Johns Hopkins do accept online courses for credit, though this is not guaranteed.
- **JST/DSST/CLEP credit** – Do not accept JST, CLEP or DSST
- **Letters of Recommendations (LOR)** – Johns Hopkins preference for letters are from teachers, college instructors, etc, but they can be flexible if students further out from their school years would like to submit a letter from another individual.
