- Application Deadlines The UC application for admission to UCI opens August 1. The submission period is October 1 - November 30. Please review the timeline for applicant's website: https://admissions.uci.edu/dates-deadlines.php?
- Yellow Ribbon Only two programs participate in the Yellow Ribbon Program: Paul Merage School of Business and School of Law

- Application Advice Veterans or active-duty military personnel: If you completed courses offered by a branch of the U.S. military, you may indicate your intention to submit your military transcript by checking the box in the "About You" section of the application. If you are admitted and accept an offer of admission, you can then submit official military transcripts (e.g., ACE, SMAART) to the UC campus.
- Fee waiver UC will waive application fees for up to four campuses for qualified students who would otherwise be unable to apply for admission. The fee waiver program is for United States citizens, permanent residents, and applicants eligible for AB540 benefits. You can see if you automatically qualify for a fee waiver within the application. If you enter your family size and income in the "About you" section, you will see if you've qualified for an application fee waiver when you select your campuses in the "Campuses & majors" section (a message will appear on that page with real-time feedback about how many campuses you can apply to for free).
- UC System A-G Courses from High School or College to be eligible for admission to UC San Diego, you must complete UC College preparatory courses (A-G courses) in the subjects below and earn a "C" grade or better. Complete at least 11 of the 15 courses before your senior year of high school.
 - UC Required Courses Generally from A-G, but UCSD adds even more specificity History (2years), English (4 years), Mathematics (4 years), Laboratory science (3 years), Language other than English (or other second language) (3 years), Visual and performing arts (1 year), College preparatory elective (1 year)
- University of California, Irvine advice for active duty U.S. military/veterans same admission requirements as traditional first-year or transfer candidate. Please review the following website: https://www.admissions.uci.edu/apply/transfer-students/index.php
 - Complete 60 semester or 90 quarter UC transferable units by the end of the spring term prior to the desired fall term admission with a minimum 2.4 GPA required
 - UC may award lower-division (freshman/sophomore level) units for military courses completed if the courses are consistent with University policy on awarding transfer credit when there is an equivalent course taught at a UC campus. UC will consult the ACE recommendations for information regarding course content and as a guide to the awarding of credit. Credit for military courses is determined after matriculation at UC.
 - Letters of Recommendation– Don't send official transcripts when you apply. If you're admitted to UCI, then you will need to submit final transcripts to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions by July 1. UCI does not accept letters of recommendation.
- Personal Insight Questions Your responses to the personal insight questions are an important component of your freshman or transfer application. Your responses allow us to get to know you through your experiences and accomplishments.
 - Freshman applicants must respond to four short-answer prompts chosen from <u>eight options</u>.
 - Transfer applicants must respond to four short-answer prompts—one mandatory prompt and their choice of three from the other <u>seven options</u>.
 - \circ Each response is limited to a maximum of 350 words.
- SAT / ACT UCI will not consider SAT or ACT scores for admission or scholarship purposes. After enrollment, exams may be used for class placement or some graduation requirements.
 - Other Considerations:

- Academic accomplishments in light of your experiences and special circumstances, including but not limited to: disabilities, low family income, first generation to attend college, need to work, disadvantaged social or educational environment, difficult personal and family situations or circumstances, refugee status or veteran status
- Outstanding performance in one or more academic subject areas
- JST/DSST/CLEP credit –accepted
- Deferment Policy Under certain circumstances, a request for deferring admission may be considered on a case-by-case basis:
 - United States Armed Forces active military orders changing an applicant's ability to enroll in the term to which they have been admitted. Applicant must be an active U.S. military member.
