- **Application Deadlines** - Please review application deadlines for updates
- **Application Advice** - When filling out the Application for Admission, please complete sections which do not seem directly relevant to your personal, academic, and military experiences to the best of your ability. For example, the application asks about your extracurricular activities, awards, and honors. Veteran applicants should feel free to include military experiences and distinctions, high school experiences, and any other post-secondary experiences in these sections. At times, some schools welcome you to attach /upload/copy and

paste a résumé or CV to explain your non-academic experiences more thoroughly. POC suggests noting part of Leadership Scholar Program, Warrior Scholar Project, and Service To School connections if applicable

- **Coalition and Common Application** – if applying to more than one school, review admission requirements to see if can use same application for multiple schools – Using Common App or Coalition App allows Marine to deposit one set of all documents. Schools pull from repository.
- **Transfer Student Qualification / Credits needed to transfer** – ANY amount assuming ever attended a college full time or as a degree seeking student – if Marine has never attended college full time nor applied to a school as a degree seeking student, Marine is a freshman; however, having credit does not equal being competitive
- **Warrior Scholar Project** – Stanford and LSP recommend that Marines consider attending this free, academic preparation course – See: <http://warrior-scholar.org/courses.html>
- **Stanford Summer Session** – Veterans at an accredited Community College should consider applying to <https://summer.stanford.edu/veterans/> - this is an excellent program and opportunity to study at a top institution;

- **LORs freshman** – need counselor's recommendation and a second academic recommendation
- **LORs transfer** – prefer 2 academic, but one may be non-academic
- **SAT / ACT** – SAT CR + M averages are 700+ on both parts for old test; ACT Composite + writing – 31 to 35 averages –
- **SAT FOR TRANSFER Students** – Stanford does not currently require any standardized testing, including SAT, ACT, and SAT Subject Tests.
- **JST credit reviewed after acceptance and applied** – cannot be used to meet transfer status
- **APPLICANTS – MAKE SURE TO ADD LSP, WARRIOR SCHOLAR, POSSE, OR SERVICE TO SCHOOL AFFILIATION ON APPLICATION**
- **Transfer Personal Essay** - The Transfer Application Personal Essay asks you to provide a statement addressing your reasons for transferring and the objectives you hope to achieve.
- **Stanford Short Essays** - Candidates respond to all three essay topics. There is a 100-word minimum and a 250-word maximum for each essay.
 1. Stanford students possess an intellectual vitality. Reflect on an idea or experience that has been important to your intellectual development.
 2. Virtually all of Stanford's undergraduates live on campus. Write a note to your future roommate that reveals something about you or that will help your roommate—and us—know you better.
 3. What matters to you, and why?
- **Transferable Credit / Online Credit** - generally means liberal arts / science / math credit (e.g. general education) from a regionally accredited 2-year or 4-year, traditional institution; subject to strict review by university; review done only after matriculation – no equivalent course outcomes a course may be transferred in, but only as elective credit; Online Credit is not accepted / Credit must be from a regionally accredited institution, substantially similar to a course offered at Stanford, C- or better, and does not duplicate previous work.
- **JST/DSST/CLEP credit** – NONE; Stanford like all Ivies does not accept non-traditional credit or online credit
