FIRST-YEAR ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS



The most competitive applicants to UC San Diego present an academic profile much stronger than the minimum UC admission requirements below.

FIRST-YEAR

- First-Year applicants are in high school or graduated from high school and have not enrolled in or attended fall, winter or spring session at a college or university.
- Apply as a first-year even if you've completed college courses during high school (including dual enrollment) and/or through the summer immediately after graduation.

COURSEWORK

C OR BETTER IN THESE COURSES

The "A–G" subject requirements represent the 15 minimum college preparatory courses that first-year applicants must have to meet UC admission requirements. For UC San Diego, we recommend going beyond by completing 11 of the 15 "A–G" requirements by the end of the junior year.
