- Application Deadlines Please review deadlines on Web site for any changes
- **Application Advice** When filling out the Application for Admission, please complete sections which do not seem directly relevant to your personal, academic, and military experiences to the best of your ability. For example, the application asks about your extracurricular activities, awards, and honors. Veterans include military experiences and distinctions, high school experiences, and any other post-secondary experiences.
- Essay / Personal Statement-personal statement / Cornell Questions Times New Roman, 12-point font,

- Transferable Credit / Online Credit liberal arts / science / math credit (e.g. general education) from a regionally accredited 2-year or 4-year, traditional institution; subject to strict review by university;
 JST/DSST/CLEP credit JST/DSST/CLEP credits are considered credentials for admission but not transferable
- Freshman AND Transfer Student Minimum Requirements Each School at Cornell has its own transfer requirements (see below); meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission; applicants must indicate one undergraduate college/school in the application and answer the corresponding essay prompt; all candidates must be ready for calculus or at least statistics as Algebra/Trig/Precalculus are not offered by the university
