College Admission Policy – Transfer

Credit Required to Transfer – 30

<u>Y</u>	Required GPA – none, generally 3.5+

<u>Y</u>	Official High School Transcripts
<u>N</u>	Letters of Recommendation (LOR) – not required, but optional
<u>Y</u>	Midterm Grades (see notes) – for currently enrolled students only

- **Application Deadlines** – Please review deadlines on Web site for any changes
- **Application Advice** - When filling out the Application for Admission, please complete sections which do not seem directly relevant to your personal, academic, and military experiences to the best of your ability. For example, the application asks about your extracurricular activities, awards, and honors. Veteran applicants should feel free to include military experiences and distinctions, high school experiences, and any other post-

secondary experiences in these sections. At times, some schools welcome you to attach /upload/copy and paste a résumé or CV to explain your non-academic experiences more thoroughly.

- **Application Fee / Waiver for Veterans** – Fee waiver is automatically placed on the Common App (freshman or transfer) for our applicants who have honorably served. No code is needed; applicants will be able to submit the Common App without paying the \$75 fee.
- **GPA minimum does not equate to competitive GPA** –for transfer 3.5 is competitive; for freshman 4.0-4.5 W GPA. However, GPA is in context to the specific high school & school profile.
- **Essay / Personal Statement**– Personal Statement + W&M additional questions
- **SAT / ACT** – We are test optional for freshmen & transfer students through 2023. Students can choose to submit scores and we do “superscore”. Recommend scores 1300+ for SAT & 30+ for ACT.
- **Transfer Midterm Grades and College Report** – Forms are linked on our [Transfer Application Checklist](#)
- **Transferable Credit / Online Credit** - generally means liberal arts / science / math credit (e.g. general transfer-oriented education) from a regionally accredited 2-year or 4-year, traditional institution; subject to strict review by university; online credit is accepted based on guidelines above
- **JST/DSST/CLEP credit** – DSST not accepted; CLEP and JST very little if any
- **FlexTrack Students** – optional program for local & NON-Traditional Students with significant time constraints like family and/or full-time employment – max of 20 such students a year and offers flexible scheduling; See: <http://www.wm.edu/offices/deanofstudents/academicpolicies/flextrackfaqs/index.php>
- **Transfer Student Requirements** -
 - **Minimum Course Requirements** – successful applicants have completed many courses within the following areas prior to transfer – general education coursework
 - **Mathematics and Quantitative reasoning** – College Algebra, Statistics and above
 - **Natural Sciences – with labs**
 - **Social Science courses**
 - **World Culture and History** – ideally foreign languages through the 202 level unless demonstrated proficiency through the SAT II Subject Tests (graduation requirement – not an admission requirement)
 - **Literature and Art History**
 - **Creative and Performing Arts**
 - **Philosophy, Religion, Sociology**
 - **Example Coursework Expected** - Calculus I; Biology with Lab; Microeconomics; English Literature; Introduction to Philosophy OR Probability and Statistics; Chemistry with Lab; Introduction to Shakespeare; Cultural Anthropology; Intermediate French I – simply note the rigor of the coursework expected
- **High School / College Prep Courses – Freshman Candidates** – William and Mary expects a rigorous list of courses from high school with classes like calculus, biology, chemistry, physics, foreign language, AP/IB/DE coursework
- **Midyear / Secondary Grade Reports** – forms found in Common and Coalition applications
